The study blends cultural history with contemporary ecological concerns, drawing attention to how sacred geographies are being eroded by unplanned urbanization and policy neglect. His call for integrated river rejuvenation strategies resonates deeply with today’s urban environmental crises. Shifting the focus to the educational landscape, **Vivek Jaiswar** contributes a timely critique in “**Bhartiya pariksha pranali mein mulyankan evam rachanavaad.**” The article deconstructs the Indian examination system through the lens of constructivist pedagogy. It highlights the limitations of memory-based testing and argues for a student-centric model that


